#### RENT AND UTILITY ASSISTANCE DONATIONS INCREASE

In February's newsletter, we reported how Mary Ellen Reese of Oceanside used her \$600 stimulus check to make a donation to Brother Benno's rental and utility assistance program, which helps families and individuals who are have trouble making payments. Mary Ellen said she encouraged others through a message on "Next Door" to consider using their stimulus checks to make donations for rental and utility assistance as well.

We are pleased to report that support for our rental and utility assistance program continues to increase through the kind efforts of donors such as Mary Ellen, as well as grants from other charitable organizations and local governments. Since February, individual contributions of \$12,700 have been received specifically for this program. Further, Brother Benno's has been fortunate to receive grants this fiscal year in the total amount of \$76,000 from other charitable organizations and city governments.

This fiscal year, we have issued \$170,000 in rental and utility assistance to unemployed and low-income families and individuals in North San Diego County. The \$170,000 breaks down to \$61,000 issued to recipients in Vista, \$55,000 in Oceanside, \$14,000 in Carlsbad, and \$45,000 in other North County locations. A total of 321 households, consisting of 722 household members, received this support; 32 households with 104 members were provided with temporary housing. These families and individuals—many of whom suffered financially due to COVID-19—are grateful for this much needed support.

We are particularly fortunate to have **Mary Holguin** run our rental and utility

assistance program. Mary has volunteered her services on almost a full-time basis for the past 20 years, always being available to those in need. **Dennis Pinnick**, active with Brother Benno's since 2010, leads our team of case workers who volunteer their time to work directly with persons in need of temporary housing.

We are grateful for the many individual contributors and other charitable organizations and government offices who help us assist families and individuals at risk of homelessness or those who cannot pay their rent and/or utility bills. The burden they feel degrades and strains family life. The support we are able to offer renews hope to these people who are struggling to move out of poverty.

#### SPOTLIGHT: MEET DANIEL AND ALMA BOONE

Both **Daniel** and **Alma** have been volunteers at Brother Benno's for more than 25 years, providing care in so many ways. They were introduced to the Foundation by **Abbott Claude Ehringer** at the Prince of Peace Abbey in Oceanside, who was Abbot from 1983 to 1994. (**Brother Benno Garrity** was also a monk at the Abbey.) The Boones decided to become involved because of their love for the poor.



Daniel was a member of the Foundation's Board for many years, and as such, was a liaison between the Board and the Brother Benno Auxiliary. Alma worked in the Kitchen preparing lunches, and she's been a member of the Auxiliary for many years. She also worked at other jobs at the Center and the Brother Benno Thrift Shop.

Daniel started his service as a truck driver, picking up donations from grocery stores. Later, he was asked to help in the Intake Office and then the Accounting Office, where he was the lead accountant for many years. This group provides accounting information to the Board, which oversees the financial health of the Foundation.

Daniel and Alma have been married for 69 years. They met on a flight to Mexico City when Daniel was in the Army. They began a long-distance relationship by mail and eventually married in Georgia, where they lived for a year before moving to Anaheim, California. In Anaheim, they

had their first experience of serving the homeless. When they moved to Oceanside, it seemed inevitable that they would continue that service when they met Abbot Claude.

Daniel is inactive at Brother Benno's now, although he is the Honorary Treasurer of the Board.

Reflecting on their experiences of all these years, Daniel and Alma feel that Brother Benno's has been the best experience for them. They value being part of the Brother Benno Family of wonderful people and friends. Their lives are a testament to doing what they have been guided to do with open hearts and plenty of hard work.


