MOTORCYCLE CLUBS HELP THOSE LESS FORTUNATE

Brother Benno's has been fortunate the past three years to receive a copious number of donations from The Posse, a motorcycle club made up entirely of AA men and women who blend their love of motorcycles with their desire to help the less fortunate. This year they gave us 5,000 pairs of socks, and 150 each of blankets, belts, and knit caps.

Jim Shlemmer, one of our Program mentors, said that they sometimes hold an AA meeting right at the Center when club members visit; and our current Program members attend as well. "We had 70 people one time, meeting in our warehouse," he said, "and the sharing was very powerful. It's people getting together to do God's work by being of service."



Kia of Cerritos partnered with the club by donating the money to purchase these items at the Garment District in Los Angeles. Another motorcycle club, Bikers Against Child Abuse, is also involved with this outreach.

Clubs members come to the Brother Benno Center on a Saturday to distribute the items, and they come away with no doubt that this is where they want to help. Besides their donations, members have shared a meal with our Guests, showing concern and encouraging them in their struggles.

The Brother Benno Recovery Program puts two "winners" together: a strict adherence to Alcoholics Anonymous and a strong focus on service to others. The service aspect seems to be unique among the many recovery programs available, and it continues to prove that giving men and women who are struggling with their addictions the opportunity to make a difference in someone else's life makes permanent change more likely.


