

Marie began volunteering with the holiday meals in 2012 with her husband and other family members and friends. She brought along five volunteers that first year. From her first time volunteering, Marie was struck by the spiritual experience of the day. She describes the calm at the Center as the dining room and serving line are set up and prepared. Next there is a burst of "amazing" energy when our Guests arrive. At the end there is quiet again as the Guests depart and the cleanup takes place.

"Our volunteers," Marie explained, "some of them have been with us for 10 to 15 years. I think that shows what they get out of the experience."

Marie has taken over coordinating the volunteers for these two special meals. She was inspired to do so after working with **Suzy Martinek**, long time volunteer and former Board member.

"I think what's so beautiful is that we all come together," Marie shared. "It doesn't matter if you are unhoused, an addict, you only have the clothes on your back – we love you as you are. There is something really wonderful about that."

Aiding Needy Community College Students' Progress With Their Education

Our community college scholarship program continues providing financial aid students disadvantaged by language barriers and/or social, economic, and educational circumstances attending MiraCosta College in Oceanside and Palomar College in San Marcos. We are fortunate to work closely with the Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS) staff at both MiraCosta and Palomar Colleges in making Brother Benno scholarship opportunities available. This Fall semester, twenty \$500 scholarships were awarded to students attending MiraCosta College and twenty \$500 scholarships were awarded to students attending Palomar College.

With reports of 14% or more of community college students affected by homelessness and almost half of students facing housing insecurity, we are hopeful to be able to continue to expand our scholarship program and assist students who are on an educational path to improve their lives.


