# Brother Benno's partnering with San Diego County and City of Oceanside for a coordinated outreach event at Brother Benno's on January 4!

This is a good way to start the new year. In partnership with San Diego County's new Department of Homeless Solutions & Equitable Communities (HSEC) and City of Oceanside, Brother Benno's will be hosting a Live Well outreach event on January 4th from 8AM to 3PM at our Oceanside Center facility. HSEC will provide Live Well on Wheels (Live WoW) bus for this January event. The Live WoW bus is fully equipped and staffed for a variety of health and human services services for our Guests. This event will serve persons experiencing homelessness and low income households and is designed to combine the efforts of different government agencies and non-profit organizations in one stop. Brother Benno's is pleased to host this event at our facility and we welcome the opportunity to further our partnership with San Diego County and the City of Oceanside.



In last month's Newsletter \* we reported the opening of our Hub Center at Brother Benno's Oceanside facility. As reported, our Hub Center offers a central location for Brother Benno's outreach team to combine efforts and work closely together at the same location with partners from government agencies and other North County non-profit organizations. We were pleased to see the roll out of San Diego County HSEC homeless services team in North County. This team of case managers, licensed clinical social workers and benefits specialists will be partnering with us at the Hub and is actively engaged with Brother Benno's outreach team to support the variety of needs of our Guests. HSEC team provides self-sufficiency program determinations (General Relief, Cal-Works, MediCal, and CalFresh), person-centered and trauma informed case management and links to appropriate partner services with ultimate goal of housing. We look forward to the January 4th Live Well event and our continued mutual efforts to aid persons in need.


"We love serving at Brother Benno's," said Jan Spires from the Catholic Daughters serving team, which has been helping out for 30 years.




