TrueCare Mobile Health Clinic Brings Medical and Dental Staffs to our Homeless Guests

We are thrilled with our recent partnership with the non-profit TrueCare and their provision of free medical and dental care to unsheltered (homeless) persons from their TrueCare Mobile Wellness Unit. TrueCare's mobile clinic, housed in a 36-foot-long vehicle, arrives early each Monday morning at Brother Benno's Oceanside facility and brings medical and dental facilities and a dedicated staff of health care professionals. The mobile clinic has an examination room, equipment for physicals, women's health care, behavioral health, chiropractic treatment, and immunizations. If health needs cannot be fully addressed at the mobile clinic, the medical staff refers people experiencing homelessness to True-Care's health center in Oceanside.

Since starting weekly visits in October 2022, appointments have been filled by a very thankful group of our homeless Guests, many of whom have lacked even minimum medical/dental care for a number of years.



After examining 95 of our homeless Guests, the medical staff provided several recommendations to improve the hygiene of homeless persons, a majority of whom, not surprisingly, have skin problems and suffer from fungal or bacterial infections. By working with TrueCare's medical and dental staffs and receiving their continued input, our caseworker staff is also learning how to guide our guests in improved hygiene and direct them to medical/dental care.

We are thankful for the dedicated efforts of TrueCare's staff of health care professionals. At the start of each week at our Oceanside facility, their visit offers hope and encouragement to our unsheltered guests.

Art Donated With Heart

Over the years, scores of friends in the local community have supported the Brother Benno Foundation. One such ally is a talented local artist named Fred M.

Last year when Fred was made aware that Brother Benno's was giving some of its recovery homes a much-needed facelift, he offered to populate the newly remodeled homes with some of his artwork. Brother Benno's gratefully accepted the offer. When the time came to see the gift, the Brother Benno Foundation was quite taken aback. His abstract paintings are exceptional, full of bright, uplifting colors and bold strokes. Within the colors there are uplifting messages of hope and faith, a spiritual message for our newly sober program members to grow and develop.



Fred wasn't always an artist. His talent was repressed for years. It wasn't until he was 50 years old, newly bankrupt, and had just lost his home when he began using the talent with which he was born. He started showing abstract paintings at an art show in Carlsbad. Painting evolved into mixed media, including wall sculptures, using metal, copper and MDF (a processed wood). He began expanding his displays to art shows in the desert communities: Palm Springs, Palm Desert, and La Quinta.

Today Fred is semi-retired, but he is still giving to the community. In addition to Brother Benno's, Fred has donated his artwork to "Turning Point", a crisis center for drug and alcohol abuse.

With the generous support of community members like Fred, the Brother Benno Foundation is in good hands.

honorary members, Brother Benno's will be able to ensure the continued pursuit of this mission by tapping into their extensive experience and enabling a smooth transition into the future.

Mary began volunteering with Brother Benno's over two decades ago. She has worked in a number of different capacities and eventually became an indispensable part of the outreach effort, as well as facilitating monetary assistance to provide for utilities, bus passes, motels, and rentals. For the last several years, she has been a board member and has been responsible for reporting on these areas. As Joe likes to points out, Mary has a "great heart" and is quickly able to discover the source of any problem.

Richard, who is a clinical psychologist and who was previously an ordained priest, became a board member in 1987 and has been responsible for the recovery program. In that capacity, he has met with recovering individuals on a weekly basis. Richard continues to attend all board meetings so as to provide guidance regarding historical precedent. Over his many years of involvement, he recognizes that he has often learned through his own mistakes. He hopes to pass down the knowledge that he has accumulated over the past four decades so that we can avoid those same mistakes in the future.

Both Mary and Richard have been integral to Brother Benno's for many years and their appointment as founding Honorary Board Members will help ensure their continued participation and serve as a tribute to their lasting legacies.


