Recovery Homes: Renovation Project

Did you know that the Brother Benno Foundation owns and operates seven houses for our drug and alcohol recovery program? Thanks to grants and support from donors, we have been able to make approximately \$100,000 in improvements to five of these homes this year. Board Member **Gregg Prather** has been overseeing the rehabilitation of our phase one houses for male residents in our program. These two houses had not had significant renovations in over 15 years and had well over 200 program members passing through the houses during that time.

"A significant amount of the work was performed by our exceptional maintenance team, **Ron** Lamb and James White," said Gregg Prather.

The work on these houses includes new flooring, drywall repair and painting, installing new doors, bathroom renovations, new beds and new appliances. A new roof was installed on one of the sober living houses. The exterior of several of our houses was also painted.

All these improvements could not have been done without some inconvenience. The extensive construction work required the relocation of some of our recovery program members while a particular house was being renovated. Thanks so much to the participants and leaders of our Recovery Program for their patience while we went through this remodeling process.

As we look back at the events of this year, we have much to be thankful for, particularly for those events supporting our mission to uplift the dignity of our Guests and for our Guests to continue to be inspired to improve their lives. Our thanks include:

We are thankful for being able to renovate and upgrade our warehouse at the Brother Benno Center. The renovation improves the efficiency of handling and distributing donated food items, not only to our kitchen and pantry for use by our Guests, but in distributing food items each week to an increasing number of other community organizations.

We are thankful for progress in completing a long planned renovated kitchen and serving line that will provide a caring and welcoming environment for serving meals to our valued Guests. Our dedicated serving team volunteers help us to feed the hungry Monday through Saturday. We are truly grateful for their support.

We are thankful for the combined use of our "Hub Center" by our Community Outreach team, the San Diego County's Homeless Services team, and caseworkers from other charity organizations that offer supportive care to unsheltered persons and extremely low-income households.

We are thankful for the update of four homes that shelter members participating in our twenty-six-week substance abuse recovery program. These houses provide well-cared for environments supporting the objectives of our twelve step Alcoholics Anonymous program.

We are thankful to be able to provide rental and utility assistance to an increasing number of families seeking to avoid eviction and becoming homeless or suffering the trauma of losing utility services.

We are thankful for an active Thrift Shop which supports the community with a wide assortment of discounted clothing, household items, and is actively making plans for our annual children's Christmas party.

We are thankful to be able to continue to provide financial aid to extremely low-income students who are attending MiraCosta and Palomar Colleges.

We are thankful to be able to distribute clothing and offer other essential services each day to sustain and support our Guests.

We are thankful for being teamed with Humanity Showers and the use of their mobile showers to provide up to seventy showers each day, four days each week to unsheltered guests.

We are particularly thankful for the contributions of you, our donors, volunteers, partners, and staff members whose unselfish efforts continue to improve Brother Benno's services and assistance to those individuals and families in need.


