### HAPPY 40TH ANNIVERSARY TO BROTHER BENNO'S!

It all began 40 years ago with a desire to feed the hungry and help the poor. **Harold** and **Kay Kutler** opened Brother Benno's Kitchen on October 23, 1983. The kitchen was named after **Brother Benno Garrity** from the Prince of Peace Abbey.

"Knowing the history of Brother Benno's and how it essentially was started by one man who decided to dedicate everything he had in his whole life to this, it's a reminder that there are some extraordinary people out there doing some special things," said Essential Services Manager, **Ben Meyer**. "I think it's a healthy reminder that one person can make a huge difference."

From its humble beginning of feeding the poor, Brother Benno's fully embraced the charge of scripture (Matthew 25: 31-45) to address the needs of the "least of us." Its programs change and save lives, by providing food and services to the working poor, feeding and assisting the homeless, clothing those in need, and treating those suffering from addiction with dignity and respect.

Brother Benno's has served 4,917,273 meals since the end of September 2023. During our 40th year we will serve our 5 millionth meal. Brother Benno's services grew over time from its start in 1983. It has been at its current location, The Brother Benno Center, since 1991. The original Brother Benno's Kitchen is now used to house sober living residents. These individuals find a job, pay a reasonable rent, and get support in recovery. According to those who run our recovery program, it is 20 times better than the national average.

The expanded services also include providing clothing to those in need in two ways. One is through a free donation program and the other

is through our Thrift Store that provides clothing and other essentials at a very reduced rate to low-income families and individuals.

Volunteers continue to be crucial to operations at Brother Benno's. Over 140 individuals (including our Board of Directors) volunteer regularly and an additional 150 or more members of the community serve breakfast or brunch once a month with their serving teams.

"It truly fills my heart to help and offer what I can," said volunteer **Lori Johnstone**. "Even if it's a smile, a hug or just acknowledging folks by name. There is such love in this organization and the people who devote their personal time are truly amazing."

The Brother Benno Foundation will be celebrating its 40-year milestone throughout the months ahead. Plans are being established for a supporter appreciation celebration in the spring of 2024. In addition, the <u>\$40 for 40</u> fundraising campaign will help Brother Benno's to continue its work for another 40 years. (See more on page 3.)

Last year, 450 children were invited to attend, and the hope is that this year there will be sufficient donations for a similar number. Each child will receive a stocking with gifts, including a \$25 gift card, pajamas, and a stuffed toy. There will be a DJ with music, as well as cookies and hot chocolate. Guests will be able to have a photo taken with both Mr. and Mrs. Claus.

What does it take to put on a party like this? Many, many volunteers and very generous donations. Preparations for the party start every August, and ramp up quickly beginning in December. Volunteers assist with everything from wrapping gifts to sorting donations and setting up on the day of the party. Helen Parsons, who has overseen the party for the past 10 years, notes, "There are so many good people involved!" One family in Carlsbad, Chris and Brenda Shea, enlist their neighborhood in a community event to stuff the stockings. This year, other volunteers are knitting hats, gloves, and scarves to add to the stockings. Volunteers are still needed to paint faces or help with craft projects on the day of the party.

Donations, including brand new books, wrapping paper, and, of course, money for the gift cards, are always welcome and can be dropped off at the Thrift Store with a note that it is for the Christmas party.

### SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO 23 PALOMAR COLLEGE EOPS STUDENTS

We're excited to share that the Brother Benno Foundation awarded twenty-three, \$500 scholarships to Palomar College Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) students on October 9.

Eligible scholarship applicants had to have completed at least one semester at Palomar college prior to applying for the scholarship, have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average, be enrolled in 6 or more units of coursework, and be enrolled in the EOPS program.

Scholarship recipients were selected based on several factors including how poverty, homelessness, drug or alcohol abuse/addiction, or having aged out the foster care system has affected their education. The number of applications received for this scholarship highlights both students' incredible drive to pursue post-secondary education to improve their career opportunities, be better role models for their children or contribute to their communities as well as the deep need for financial assistance.

These fall scholarships were made possible through a \$10,00 funding commitment from the Brother Benno Foundation and a private \$1,500 donation which increased the total scholarships available from twenty to twenty-three. Brother Benno's Scholarship Program was established in 2008.

Forty-six applications were reviewed by our Brother Benno Scholarship Committee. Members of the committee include Joyce Cerimele, Kristal Cerimele, Suzy Martinek, James O'Connell, and Belinda Smith. We're grateful to our scholarship committee members for their conscientious work and time intensive commitment to reviewing the applications and making some tough decisions.

A similar scholarship opportunity has been made available for Mira Costa College EOPS students. Mira Costa scholarships will be awarded in November.

This was perfect timing with guests finishing breakfast and then walking over to Amber for the vaccine.



There was a mother with 3 small children. I held the baby while she ate and helped her kids.

Shortly after, the center on Production Ave. was opened. A few times my kids and I served at lunch on Saturday or Sunday. It wasn't long after that, that they started serving breakfast and sending sacks lunches with guests. And not long after that we moved out of state. Many years later we moved back and I served as a greeter at the center for many years.

If you haven't read "Soup, Soap, Hugs, and Hope" you should. Three truly wonderful people started this organization which blessed thousands of people for decades.


