PREDAWN'S DELICIOUS DEEDS: How Their Support Feeds Hundreds!

Long before the sun rises, while most of us are still deep in sleep, a remarkable group of New Song Community Church volunteers arrives at Brother Benno's kitchen. At 3:50 AM, these resolute individuals begin their vital mission: preparing over 600 sandwiches weekly for our community's homeless and working poor neighbors.

This extraordinary team of six embodies the true spirit of community service. The most recent group members, **Tom** and **Kelly**, have volunteered for four years. **Pat** and **Gina** have been with the group for six years. **Kana** has been making sandwiches for ten years. And, **Ed**, the longest-serving member with seventeen years of service, plans to keep making sandwiches until he retires after completing his twentieth year. Undeterred by inclement weather, they arrive without fail to ensure that hundreds of sandwiches are available for hungry people.

Working with ingredients from Brother Benno's food recovery program, these volunteers transform donated deli meats and tuna into essential meals that fill brown bag lunches. Going far beyond sandwich making – they manage all aspects of their operation, from first setup to final cleanup.

In a world where commitments often waver, these volunteers' dedication is remarkable. **Ed** shared that he volunteers "out of joy, for the fellowship, and the feeling of helping someone."

Once completed, the indoor market is expected to serve over 1,000 families and individuals monthly while creating new volunteer opportunities for community members passionate about fighting hunger.
