With Welcoming Smiles and the Comforting Warmth of a Hot Breakfast, Serving Teams Offer **Connection and Hope**

Every morning something remarkable happens. As dawn breaks over Brother Benno's Center, dedicated volunteer groups gather 4-8 members together to serve hot, nutritious breakfasts to our community's working poor and unsheltered neighbors. This daily act of compassion has been transforming lives since 1983, and we invite you to become part of this inspiring tradition.

A WARM WELCOME AND A HOT MEAL

Six days a week, volunteer teams arrive bright and early to open for service at 6:30 AM, bringing warmth and sustenance to those who need it most. Each day offers a different menu with a weekday special of a traditional hot breakfast complimented by a continental-style helping of dairy, fruit and pastries as local grocery donations provide. All our guests get a lunch tray and can choose which options they want as they go along and the volunteers interact and serve them food items. Breakfast options are always finished with a hot coffee and cream, of course!

SATURDAY BRUNCH

On Saturdays, a special 10:00 AM brunch is served featuring the community partner, Chik-Fil-A (with a little addition of gravy) or traditional spaghetti and always a side of vegetables and garlic bread.

On the second Saturday of every month, we are treated to one of a few rotating volunteer teams each team may end up serving a few times per year. Some volunteers help with breakfast on the traditional serving line, dishing food, helping with coffee and

The Brother Benno Scholarship committee is proud to share with you that 40 scholarships totaling \$24,000 were recently awarded to EOPS students at Palomar and MiraCosta Community Colleges.

This spring saw a remarkable increase in applications, with over 150 students competing for this crucial support. From recent high school graduates taking their first steps in higher education to determined individuals returning to college to reshape their career trajectories, these 40 students represent the diverse and inspiring faces of educational perseverance and resilience.

In a brief email acknowledging her selection, scholarship recipient C.M. shared, "Thank you so much! There have been MANY times that I have wanted to give up, drop out, and quit pursuing my dreams. Opportunities like this push me to continue."

Impacted by challenges including poverty, substance addiction, homelessness, and single parenthood, these awardees show academic promise, extraordinary resilience, and dedication to personal growth. Their diverse career aspirations

span agriculture, business administration, computer security, chemical and electrical engineering, nursing, teaching, and social work.

One scholarship committee member shared, "It is a privilege to get to know these students through their applications and an honor to be able to support them as representatives of our donors and the Brother Benno Foundation."

Every \$600 scholarship this spring was only possible through the generosity of individual donors and the diligent work of scholarship committee members Jerry Weseloh, Joyce Cerimele, Kristal Cerimele, and Belinda Smith.

Currently, over 200 volunteers from diverse backgrounds – individuals, church groups, businesses, and service organizations – dedicate their time to this vital mission – feeding the hungry.


